



ABOUT THE INSTRUCTOR

Sergeant Rudy Flores is a 28 year veteran of Texas law enforcement. He has served as a deputy sheriff, police officer and Trooper, Sergeant and Texas Ranger with the Department of Public Safety. Sergeant Flores holds B.S.L.S. with an Emphasis in Criminal Justice, an A.A.S. in Criminal Justice and is a graduate of the Law Enforcement Management Institute at Sam Houston State University. He has attended the Southern Police Institute's Homicide Investigation course at the University of Louisville, and has advanced training in homicide investigation, crime scene reconstruction and bloodstain pattern analysis from the Southern Institute of Forensic Science. Sergeant Flores holds certifications as a Master Police Officer, Instructor and Special Investigator by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement and has over 5,000 hours of accredited training. He is a member of the Crime Scene Investigation Working Group assigned to design, implement and instruct advanced crime scene investigation techniques for the Texas Rangers. Sergeant Flores has been accepted as an expert witness in federal and state courts on bloodstain pattern analysis and death investigation.

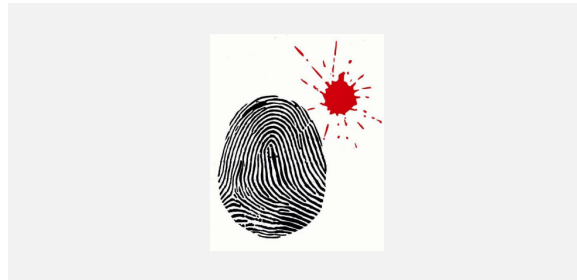
The program is taught from a hands-on point of view from investigators and forensic practitioners active in the field. The class is intended for law enforcement officers, crime scene investigators, evidence technicians and crime laboratory personnel involved in the investigation, identification, collection and preservation of evidence at violent crime scenes. The objective is to provide information needed to ensure critical pieces of evidence will be collected, fewer cases will be jeopardized by mishandled evidence and more cases will be solved through the proper use of these advanced investigative techniques. Participants will have the opportunity to apply newly acquired knowledge with practical exercises.

SUGGESTED EQUIPMENT

- Equipment selection and use for investigating crimes scenes with bloodstain and firearms evidence
- Investigative protocols for violent crime scenes
- Recognize biohazards and personnel safety procedures
