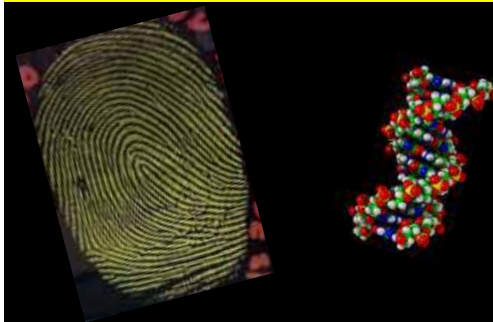

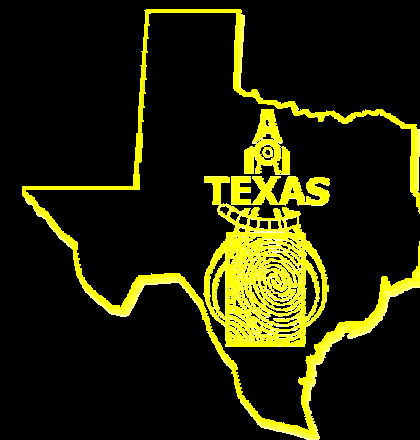

Requirements
